AWARD

This industrial dispute between Messrs. Oberoi Airport Services at Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International Airport (Domestic Terminal Buildings), Kolkata - 52 and their workman Shri Kaushik Sinha, Malancha Apartment, D-1, Block-C, 1st Floor, 251, Pulin Avenue, 2-1/2 No. Airport Gate, Kolkata – 700081 was referred by the Govt. of West Bengal, Labour Department, vide Order No.1030-I.R./IR/11L-66/12 dated 11-11-2013 to this Tribunal for adjudication of the following issues:-

#### ISSUES

- Whether the termination of service of Sri Kaushik Sinha w.e.f. 13-04-2012 1. by the management of M/s. Oberoi Airport Services was justified?
- To what relief, if any, is he entitled to? 2.

Upon receipt of the reference, the instant case No.VIII-59/2013 u/s. 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 was registered and necessary notices were served upon the parties. Both parties duly appeared and filed their respective statements of facts and list of documents, upon which the matter went into evidence. During evidence the parties entered into a mutual settlement. Accordingly, they have filed a joint petition along with a Memorandum of Settlement, with a prayer for passing an Award in terms of the settlement. The concerned workman Sri Kaushik Sinha and one Mr. Ahmad Imam Malik. who is employed in M/s. Oberoi Flight Services as Head, Corporate Affairs have deposed in support of their joint petition of compromise and terms of the Memorandum of Settlement.

In terms of the settlement, the workman Sri Kaushik Sinha has received a demand draft being No. 403947 dated 12.02.2018 issued in his favour by the Dalhousie Square Branch of H.S.B.C. Ltd., A/c. No. 031-918543-001(EIH Ltd. – Oberoi Flight Services Kol) of value Rs.2,25,000/-(Rupees Two Lakh Twenty Five Thousand Only) and issued a receipt thereof, which has been kept with the records. That apart, the company representative Mr. Ahmed Imam Malik assures that the concerned offices of the company shall assist the workman to complete the necessary formalities for release of his Provident Fund dues from the authorities.

Having examined the Memorandum of Settlement and the joint petition for compromise, as well as the evidence adduced by the parties, this Tribunal finds no impediment in allowing the prayers, made jointly by the parties, for passing of the Award in terms of the Memorandum of Settlement. Let the instant reference be disposed of in terms of Memorandum of Settlement in between the parties filed this day, which do form part of the Award.

This shall be the Award passed in Case No.VIII-59/2013, drawn up in respect of dispute vide G.O. No. 1030-I.R./IR/11L-66/12 dated 11-11-2013, referred to this Tribunal by Labour Department, Govt. of West Bengal.

### MEMORANDUM OF SETTLEMENT

IV. Short Recital of the case:

An industrial dispute between Shri Kaushik Sinha an ex-employee of the company (now closed) is pending before the Ld. 7<sup>th</sup> Industrial Tribunal, West Bengal and during the pendency of the matter one letter dated 24.02.2015 issued by Mr. N. Jayakumar, Joint G.M. (Commercial) of the Airport Authority of India has been received by Oberoi Airport Services, the company named in the Order of Reference, with regard to cessation of Licence for Operating Lounge/Restaurant-cum-Bar in New Integrated Terminal Building, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International Aiport, Kolkata and vacation of premises on expiry of Licence period and handing/taking over the charge on 28.02.2015 and in view of the said letter issued by the Licensor Aiport Authority of India the unit of the company Oberoi Aiport Services, the company named in the Order of Reference had no existence since 28.02.2015 onwards in view of handing and taking over the Licence i.e. Lounge/Restaurant-cum-Bar as per the receipt thereto by the

Airport Authority of India. The company brought such facts on record by filing a petition dated 27.08.2017. Thereafter pursuant to protracted negotiation between the parties i.e. Shri Kaushik Sinha, the ex-employee concerned and the company the matter has been settled out of Court on the following terms and conditions:

# V. Terms of Settlement:

- (a) The Company agreed to pay a sum of Rs. 2,25,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs twenty-five thousand) only by way of a package deal to Shri Kaushik Sinha in full and final settlement of all his claims, dues, wages including his claim of reinstatement and any other claim on any account whatsoever and Shri Kaushik Sinha has agreed to receive the payment of Rs. 2,25,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs twenty-five thousand) only in full and final settlement of all his claims and dues including his claim of reinstatement.
- (b) The company agrees to provide the required assistance in the process of the application for release of Provident fund by Sri Kaushik Sinha.
- VI. All disputes and issues upto and inclusive on the date of the settlement and/or in future will be deemed to have been settled.
