## **AWARD**

### Dated: 28-06-2018

None appears on behalf of the workman on repeated calls. Today was fixed for proceeding under Rule 22 of the West Bengal Industrial Dispute Rules, 1958 with liberty to the workman to appear and take steps in the meanwhile. No steps have been taken by the workman since grant of such liberty.

Records reveal that this case came to be registered on 27.02.2015 when the workman filed an application purportedly under Section 2A(2) of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, raising dispute(s) on the grounds stated therein against his employer M/s. Indian Institute of Hardware Technology Limited, with its office at No. 30, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Chowringhee Mansion, Jawaharlal Nehru Road, Park Street, Kolkata - 700016, in connection with termination of his service by such employer. Upon the case being registered, notice in prescribed Form, together with copy of such application, was sent by registered post to the OP/Company with directions to appear and file written statement. It further reveals that on 13.04.2015, the OP/Company appeared through their Ld. Advocate, however they did not file their written statement and sought further time to do so, and their such prayer was considered and allowed by this Tribunal. Records also reveal that the OP/Company filed their written statement on 29.01.2016; however, the OP/Company stopped taking steps soon thereafter (from 11.07.2016 onwards) and failed to appear before this Tribunal on several dates and ultimately by Order dated 03.07.2017, the matter was directed to proceed ex-parte against the OP/Company. Records further reveal that the applicant was given opportunity to lead his ex-parte evidence on 25.08.2017, and on several dates thereafter however, the workman has failed to lead his evidence till date, the matter being adjourned on all such dates on one ground or the other.

5d -

That apart, the workman has stopped appearing in this matter as would be evident from his absence on the last date as well as today. Clearly, the conduct of the parties before this Tribunal strongly indicates that the industrial dispute under adjudication may no longer be in existence between the parties.

In the circumstances aforesaid, this Tribunal is constrained to hold that this is a fit case to be dealt with under Rule 22 of the West Bengal Industrial Disputes Rules 1958, as the parties have failed to appear without sufficient cause being shown and that the instant industrial dispute is no longer in existence between the parties, and further this Tribunal holds that the instant case is liable to be disposed of on such terms.

Accordingly, and in terms of Rule 22 of the West Bengal Industrial Dispute Rules, 1958 as amended till date, this Tribunal holds that the instant industrial dispute being Case No.11/2A(2)/2015, instituted on 27.02.2015 is no longer in existence, between the parties.

The aforesaid constitutes the **No Dispute Award** passed by this Tribunal in the instant Case No.11/2A(2)/2015, which stands disposed of forthwith.
